
Decatur Township **Drug-Free Coalition** held its first

Community Day The intent was simple and to the point: connect the people with the community resources available to them.

Then Covid-19 arrived and Community Day disappeared.

Until July 16. Community Day reappeared in the parking lot of the Decatur Township School for Excellence, located adjacent to Decatur Central High School.

the vendors, and the community, showed up in droves, much to the excitement of coalition leaders

"We started in 2019, then Covid hit, so we had no idea what to expect today," said Jess Sandvold, Coalition Coordinator for the Decatur Township Drug-Free Coalition. "We were a little concerned that people weren't used to this event happening.' Maybe not, but they were ready.

From noon to 3 p.m., the area was busy with people from the community, and with the vendors, many of whom were concerned with safety, and some of which offered goods, beverages and food. Then there were the fun things, like unicorn rides, a dunk tank, face

Kelly Ivey said it was all worthwhile. 'This day was meant to connect people with resources," said Ivey, the Executive director for the Decatur Township Drug-Free Coalition. "We started in 2019. It's definitely a yearly thing, so this is a great

She was referring to the teams from Decatur Central, including the softball team, coached by her husband, Don. We reached out to the community and small businesses. That's

time to do it. It's always nice to get the athletic teams involved."

how we had our vendors set up. Sandvold said. The football team is here, with a dunk tank. The softball players are doing face painting. The cheerleaders are making cotton

candy. "We had about 50 vendors today, which is good turnout for the first time (in three years). We have the drug-free coalition here. It's a very good program for

parents. They're giving out free drinks. They had 200 goodie bags for the kids." Ivey said that was the plan.

"We have a federal grant so we can focus on youth prevention," she explained. "This is the fifth year of the coalition. We're going to see if we get another five-year grant.'

She turned to a nearby trailer that had people going in and out. "This drug-free trailer is new for us," she explained. "We're rolling it out, so we can meet the parents where they are.

Many of those parents, and their children, visited the grassy area just south of the parking lot. "We have unicorn rides," Sandvold said of horses that had small unicorns attached to their

heads. "As soon as we posted that, she was here, it was a huge draw." "She" is Tonda Burgin, who with husband D.J. McCord, co-own Life Vantage Farms and McQualla Carriages in Southport.

"I have been doing this for 50 years," Burgin explained, noting that it takes years to train the horses. "I started with the Jerry Lewis telethon. I was 10, and had two ponies. "Now, we have 25

"We have a petting zoo. We do birthday parties wherever you like. We have McQualla Carriages for weddings. But we don't do downtown. We're a private company. We do this for children who are handicapped or afraid of the big guys. This keeps us busy. How busy? I'm booked until September

It turned out to be a busy day for all involved.

"The Blue and Gold Academy had a backpack giveaway from 10 to noon, and they gave them all away quickly," said Sandvold. "That shows there's a need for community support and involvement. We've had good rapport so far.

"I think we're having a great day. People are glad to be out and doing this. Now, we hope to





#### **MADISON NOW OPEN!**

Bridge crews restored traffic across the brand-new Madison Avenue bridge over I-465 this past weekend to one lane in each direction. All four lanes of Madison Avenue and the sidewalks along the bridge are expected to fully open later this week.

Madison Avenue is the third of five I-465 overpasses the I-69 Finish Line project has replaced. The new bridges will provide safe travels for many decades to come and make room for future I-465 lanes on the southwest side of Indianapolis.

Carson Avenue, just west of I-65, is the fifth I-465 overpass to be replaced. It's expected to close on Sunday, July 24 for about six months. The detour follows Keystone Avenue and Thompson Road.

I-465 traffic should continue to expect nighttime lane closures and intermittent traffic stoppages near the bridgework. Crews expect to close the right lane of I-465 eastbound on Wednesday night near the

Carson Avenue overpass and the exit to I-65 southbound The Mann Road and Thompson Road intersection and the on-ramp to I-465 eastbound have reopened. Road improvements were completed during a long weekend's worth of work.
