**DC's Dixon, Harvey earn state honors**

A year ago, Decatur Central's athletic department was honored nationally, termed "exemplary" by the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association. According to the NIAAA, to be recognized as exemplary, a school official must have presented evidence of existing policies, practices and procedures that meet suggested content criteria within the 10 Quality Program Assessment (QPA) categories.

Now, there's more. Justin Dixon, leader of that department, has been named the District 3 High School Athletic Director of the Year. The award comes from the Indiana Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association, which recognizes the entire program. It also named Decatur Middle School's Missy Harvey the District 3 Middle School Athletic Director of the year. "It's super!" Dixon exclaimed. "It's humbling. I am honored. When you're selected by your peers, that says a lot. I'm happy. I'm really proud of Missy and her hard work. You're only as good as your team. There's Missy at the middle school, Sean Winkelseth at the elementary level, Derrek Staton at the high school (Dixon's assistant), Nichole DeStefano (trainer), all of those first-class people who care about Decatur Central athletics. Anything they get has been deserved. It's truly a team award. That includes our custodians and transportation people. They're all doing their part to let us do this in a first-class manner. They work hard every day to give the kids great experiences. Dixon spread the wealth even further. "Nobody gets into this for self-promotion," he said. "We want to give kids the best experience we can. It's not a goal I've strived to attain. "We've had unbelievable support from the administration toward their education-based athletes. Both in the state and nationally, as was the case with the NIAAA's "exemplary" rating last year. "Any time you're recognized, 1, by your peers, 2, by your over-seeing body, it's obviously humbling," Dixon said at the time. "One of the refreshing things about going through the process, we had information that what we're doing is good and on par with what is going on at that level." There's more. At the Indiana group's yearly board of directors meeting earlier in March, Dixon was chosen to be the first vice president of the IIAAA for the upcoming year. "To be elected as a board member – I'm excited to serve these schools all around the state," he said. There's even more. Last week, Dixon was named first vice president of the Indiana Football Coaches Association. He will serve with president Keith Kilmer of Lowell. Dixon is also the IFCA's All Star Game Day Director, since the contest, as was the case last year, will be held at Decatur Central. The game will be played July 12. "There's a lot of exciting stuff happening," Dixon understated. "I feel obligated to give back to the organizations that have served me."

**Radio Voice of '500' Jaynes headed for state broadcasters' hall of fame**

The gift is still giving. In 1975, Wayne and Linda Jaynes gave their son, Mark, a cassette recorder for Christmas. He immediately began recording himself as he watched football games and races on television. Mark is still on the air. Among all those events he has covered, Mark Jaynes is best known for becoming the radio voice of the Indianapolis 500. For all that he has done, Jaynes has been named to the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) Hall of Fame. He and five others will be inducted at the ISSA annual awards banquet on Sunday, April 7, at Valle Vista Country Club in Greenwood. Joining him will be retired Associated Press sports editor Steve Herman, the late John Bansch of the Indianapolis Star, Russ Brown of the Louisville Courier-Journal, John Montgomery of WNDI Radio in Sullivan and Jack Nolan of WNDU South Bend and Notre Dame Athletics. "I was quite surprised," Jaynes said earlier this month. "With all the people who have helped me and who are in the hall, it's very humbling. Jaynes, who is also a key cog in the IHSAA's Champions Network, was the ISSA's 2018 recipient of the Marv Bates Indiana Sportscaster of the Year Award.

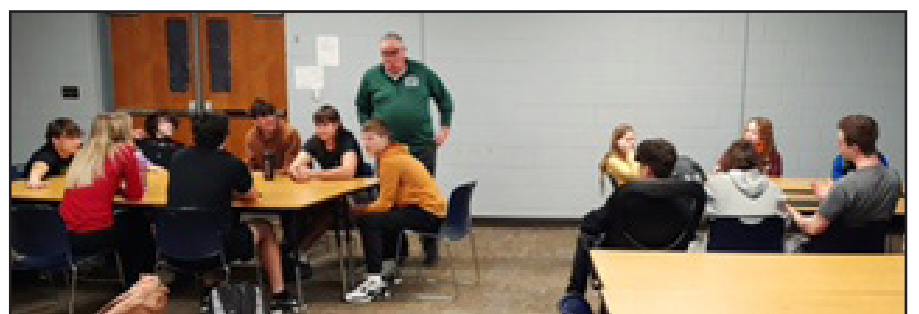
"I always seemed to be in the right place at the right time," Jaynes said. "If it all ended now, I would have accomplished everything beyond my wildest dreams. But Mark Jaynes is still at it. He's still the voice of the "500" and works with the IHSAA, but his favorite part is his current title: communications instructor for his alma mater, Monrovia High School. Before teaching at Monrovia, he taught communications classes at Beech Grove High School. "The most rewarding thing, what I enjoy the most, is teaching the kids at Monrovia," he said. "This is where the legacy is, quite frankly."

 "When I was a student in 1975 at Hall (Elementary), the principal helped me get started," he said of Nyle Denny. "He said, You're not very good at baseball, but you love sports and you can't keep your mouth shut, so you should try broadcasting." So he did. "In my sophomore year at high school, I started working morning reports at WCBK," Jaynes said. "I had two stints at WCBK. I did a couple years in the morning news and whatever they would let me do. That group of "they" included Dave Keister, Dave Sakel and John Taylor. "I want to thank those people who gave a high school kid a shot. That will always be a special time for me. I'm very, very fond of that radio station." Back at Monrovia, Jaynes also had help from teachers and coaches, including Wayne Stahley, Jim Kaiser, Doug Coddington, Dave Oberle, Phil Schneider and Mary Wood. "Mark Jaynes was a manager when I was coaching at Monrovia," said Oberle. "We needed an announcer. I asked him if he had ever announced before. He hasn't shut up since!" Upon graduation, Jaynes attended Indiana State University, where he continued his broadcasting career with ISU campus radio station WTHI. There, he worked with Barry Kent and Dave Liston. "That led me to the (Indianapolis) radio network," Jaynes said. "I got married (Desiree)

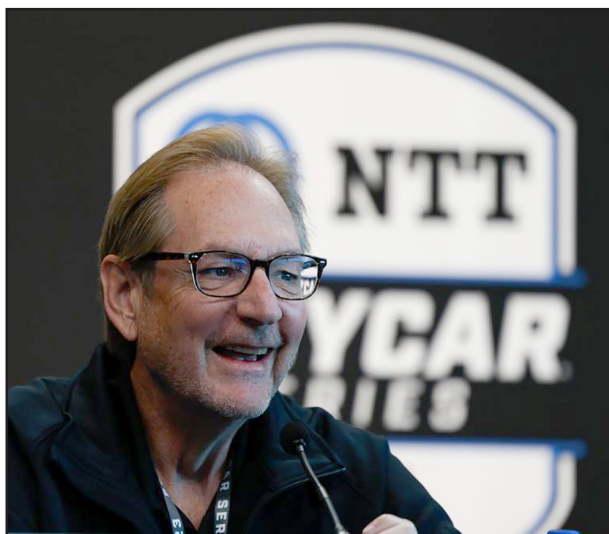

# Reinbold lines up Hunter-Reay and Daly for upcoming Indianapolis 500

A few years ago, IndyCar driver Conor Daly's passenger car broke down on the Northside near Dreyer & Reinbold auto dealership headquarters.

Daly reached out to dealership and Indianapolis 500 co-team owner Dennis Reinbold who provided Daly with a loaner car.

Reinbold laughed because Daly brought the loaned Subaru in one piece back to the dealership but neither Reinbold nor Daly were sure if the car was returned with a full tank of fuel.

Fast forward to 2024, Reinbold again is placing Daly in a car, not just any car, but the No. 24 Dreyer and Reinbold Racing/Don Cusick Motorsports Dallara-Chevrolet for the upcoming 108th running of the Indianapolis 500. Daly's teammate will be 2014 "500" winner Ryan Hunter-Reay in the No. 23 entry.

In a meeting earlier this year at the Speedway's media center, the popular Daly said, "I made sure that was in the deal for this month of May, to have a nice loaner vehicle ... I'm extremely thankful for the belief that Dennis has in me and the chance to drive one of his cars at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway."

Daly started 16th and finished eighth in last year's "500" driving for Speedway Legends Cars graduate and IndyCar team owner Ed Carpenter. He finished sixth in 2022 for Carpenter Racing.

Daly, a second-generation racecar driver, also has become a social media personality.

Daly and comedian Joey Mulinaro have a weekly podcast show, "Main Street," a new content alliance with Dale Earnhardt Jr.'s Dirty Mo Media. He drove Pacers' star Tyrese Haliburton in an IndyCar two-seater on Indy's streets to the NBA All-Star Tip-Off Party earlier this month. And last weekend, he was with the Thermal Creator Team for behind the scenes coverage of The Thermal Club \$1 Million Challenge NTT IndyCar non-points event.

The podcasts and social media are a sideshow for Daly who hasn't lost site of the team's goal.

"The Indy 500 is without a doubt my ultimate goal," Daly said. "To win, I want to be like Ryan and to be able to know what the milk tastes like. Obviously to be able to do that for Dennis would be amazing."

Hunter-Reay started 18th in the 2023 "500," led eight laps, and finished 11th in a DRR/Cusick Motorsports entry. His racecar was hampered by a broken front wing adjuster; otherwise, Hunter-Reay believed he was headed for a top-five finish. He takes aim at his 16th "500" in May.

In a twist of fate, Hunter-Reay replaced Daly last season in the last nine IndyCar races with Carpenter. He and Daly were teammates in 2019 with Andretti Autosport, and now they are teammates again with Reinbold, who also owns an auto dealership in Greenwood.

"I don't know how many cars we had in the garage," Hunter-Reay recalled of his tenure with Andretti Autosport.

"There's a whole lot of noise at that point, a whole lot of information buzzing around. It's really tough to focus on really what matters. I think in this situation, this environment with this team (DRR), I think it gives us the opportunity to push forward."

Hunter-Reay savors the DRR team's attention on the "500" with a two-car team.

"It was an absolute pleasure working with Dennis, the

entire team," he said. "It was refreshing to see the motivation in everyone's faces from day one. Just what they put into this event is special."

He emphatically added, "We'll focus on what matters, that's going out and winning the Indy 500, the greatest race in the world."

DRR is observing its 25th year in IndyCar after being among the early Indy Racing League entries and winning a race at Orlando, Florida. Reinbold has consistently focused on the "500" and has a championship team that competes in NitroCross.

"Indy was the core of what we did," Reinbold reflected. "We didn't have enough sponsorship to be able to really invest in all disciplines of racing, so we focused on Indy. We've sort of evolved to where all our time and testing, our year-round focus for the program is just directed toward the Indy 500."

DRR is among quality "one-off" entries for the 108th running of the "500" including Kyle Larson with Arrow-McLaren-Hendrick and Helio Castroneves with Meyer Shank, among others.

"Our only goal is to win this race," Reinbold attested. "We're a little past due to win this thing."

Qualifications for the "500" are Saturday-Sunday, May 18-19 with Race Day on Sunday, May 26.

# NCAA teams and Basketball Blitz advertisers roll into Sweet 16

Sixteen NCAA men's basketball teams and 11 different advertisers in The Southsider Voice's Basketball Blitz contest are alive for the Sweet 16 that unfolds Thursday and Friday with the Elite Eight taking place Saturday and Sunday.

All No. 1 seeds made it through their tests with Houston and Purdue (each Duane Lytle Landscaping), defending national champion Connecticut (Keenan-Stahl Boys & Girls Club), and North Carolina (Steele Auto Sales). Houston barely escaped Texas A&M in overtime Sunday night.

And yes, Virginia; there is Purdue. The Boilers are trying to accomplish what Virginia did in 2018 and 2019 after a historic loss to a No. 16 seed and then winning the national championship one year later.

Purdue, after rolling over its first two opponents (Grambling, 78-50 and Utah State, 106-67), has Boiler Nation abuzz while putting last year's opening loss to No. 16 Fairleigh-Dickinson farther in the rearview mirror.

The more seasoned Boilers began their mission to go deep in



this year's tourney as evidenced by 7-4 Zach Edey's combined performances of 53 points and 35 rebounds and his short but intense post-game comments.

"No pressure, just basketball," Edey said Sunday after the Boilers manhandled Grambling at Gainbridge Fieldhouse downtown.

Purdue faces No. 5 seed Gonzaga (Jockish Flowers) Friday in Detroit with No. 2 Tennessee (IU Credit Union) colliding with No. 3 Creighton (Bert and Den's Grille) with the winner's meeting Sunday to advance to the Final Four.

IU Credit Union also has No. 3 Illinois in the East and No. 4 Alabama in the West. The Fighting Illini face No. 2 Iowa State (B. Davis Remodeling), and the rugged Tide meet North Carolina. Connecticut collides with No. 5 San Diego State (Raymond James) in the East. No. 2 Arizona (Fred and Sons) faces No. 6 Clemson (Iaria's) in the West.

The Cinderella carriage has only one passenger, No. 11 North Carolina State (Duane Lytle Landscaping), that defeated No. 6 Texas Tech, 80-67 and No. 14 Oakland, 79-73. The Wolfpack has won seven games in 12 days, including their improbable run of five wins in five days to capture the ACC tournament and automatic NCAA tourney bid. Former Perry Meridian standout Jayden Taylor, a transfer from Butler, is a valuable sixth man for NC State that faces No. 2 Marquette (Iaria's). No. 4 Duke (Heimel Auction) goes up against Houston.

With multiple entries, IU Credit Union teams Baylor and Grand Canyon fell in the second round.

Southside businesses purchased 68 advertising spots in the

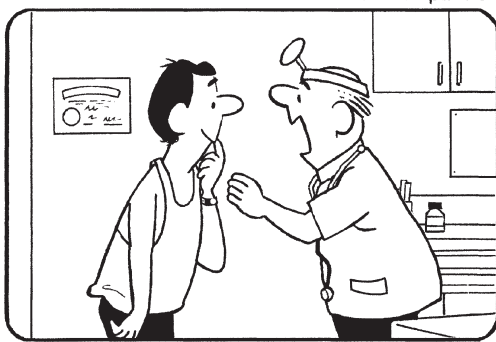
