## Hawk seniors advance to semi-state

Mission accomplished, in a manner of speaking.

The expressed goal during Saturday's IHSAA regional wrestling tournament was to advance to the Feb. 10 semi-state in Evansville.

To do that, wrestlers had to finish in the top four at the regional that was conducted in Mooresville's Curry Center Gymnasium.

Decatur Central's seniors realized that goal.

David Oyeboode took second at 165 pounds and Javian Jones placed fourth at 285.

"The goal is to have them, in their senior year, get to state," said coach Aaron Schlueter.

Oyeboode had a strong day, heading into the championship match with Brownsburg senior Jessie Derringer. He opened with a 7-2 decision of Plainfield junior Elliott Eck, then decided Ben Davis senior Gage Eckels 5-3.

He wrestled well against Derringer, but fell behind early and wound up trailing 9-4 at the finish.

"I can't dwell on it; I can't change the past, said Oyeboode, now 32-6. "Just don't let people take advantage of you. I could have wrestled better than I did."

He plans to be improved this week.

"We'll get ready," he said Saturday. "Next week gets you to state. That's the goal."

Jones opened well, decisioning Plainfield junior Tommy Spilker 7-3. But Avon senior Oluwagbenga Orisadare eked out a 3-2 decision in the semifinal round. Jones battled in the match for third place, but just missed again, falling 3-2 to South Putnam freshman Keenan Mowery-Shields.

"Today, getting to the semi-state was the goal," Schlueter said. "Now, we need to see just where we sit in the bracket. They're pretty dangerous, wherever they fit. We'll go to Evansville and wrestle our hearts out."

"We've wrestled all over the country. So we know what we need to do. We'll be coming up with a game plan."

"We'll navigate practice, see where we fit. We'll be out to get to the state tournament

next weekend. That's the goal: to get them to the next weekend – to state."

Lucas Cadwell, a junior, fell in the first round at 132 pounds. Sophomore David Falola was ousted in the first round at 144, as were freshman Daniel Adjahli at 175 and sophomore Caleb Ayetomowo at 190 and freshman Elisha Johnson at 215.

The Hawks finished seventh as a team with 20 points.

## Giants bounce Hawks from postseason

How bumpy did it get for Decatur Central's girls Wednesday night?

"We got pushed around tonight," said coach Nick Carothers. "The girls need to prepare their bodies for a physical game."

Literally and figuratively, Ben Davis bounced the Hawks from the Pike sectional. The Giants pushed, shoved and shot their way to a 66-39 decision in the opening round of the tournament.

While the Hawks advanced to the semifinal round, the Hawks saw their season stopped at 10-12.

There is some good news here.

The Hawks, who started two juniors, a sophomore and two freshmen, will be back. Only guard/forward Heaven Thompson will graduate in the spring.

Carothers cited the Hawks' relatively late start as a team as another factor.

"We have a young team battling an established program," the Hawks second-year coach noted. "We didn't get a summer of work in before the school year. We have three transfers who came right at the beginning of the school year. They're trying to learn the chemistry and style."

They learned that Ben Davis' 5-17 record going in was not indicative of the Giants' strengths.

They started fast and physical, scoring 12 of the game's first 14 points.

But the Hawks kept battling, trimming the deficit to 31-21 at one point. They got a stop, but missed their own attempt. They got another stop, but missed two free throws.

The Giants then knocked down one of their seven 3-point baskets and improved their margin to 39-25 at the half.

There would be no run for the Hawks after intermission, as they managed just a field goal by Cassandra McMasters in the third quarter and the Giants pushed out to a 45-25 lead.



## Indy No. 12 among nation's best cities for football fans

Indy ranks 12th among the nation's best cities for football fans, according to rankings released in a Super Bowl LVIII preview by wallethub.com.

The top five cities were Pittsburgh, Dallas, Green Bay, Los Angeles and Boston. Pittsburgh and Green Bay tied with "the most engaged fans" in the report.

The data compared cities with at least one professional or at least one college football team ranging from stadium capacity to fan engagement.

One analyst stated, "Deciding the best football cities ultimately comes down to a combination of how successful the cities' teams are, how easy it is for spectators to enjoy games, and how dedicated the local fanbase is."

Among cities with a univer-



sity that has a college football team, West Lafayette, Muncie, and Terre Haute were ranked ahead of Bloomington among small cities.

The report also showed many interesting Super Bowl LVIII statistics with Super Bowl LVIII unfolding between Kansas

City and San Francisco in Las Vegas:

\*\$6,680: The average cost of a ticket to the past five Super Bowls.

\*\$8,586: Lowest price of a Super Bowl LVIII ticket on resale market after conference championships.

\*16.2 million: Americans plan to watch the game at a bar or restaurant.

\*192 percent: 20-year increase in cost of a 30-second Super Bowl commercial; cost is \$7 million this year.

\*\$157,000: Super Bowl bonus paid each member of the Chiefs last year; \$82,000 paid to each Philadelphia Eagles player.

\*112.2 million: Americans plan to throw or attend a Super Bowl party.

\*14: Number of people expected to attend the average Super Bowl party.

\*8,083: Average calories per

person for a football party feast.

\*35 percent: Increase in pizza deliveries on Super Bowl Sunday compared to a regular season NFL Sunday.

\*74 percent: Americans say they eat more during Super Bowl than any other sporting event or party.

\*75 percent: Chips and dips ranking as favorite Super Bowl party foods, then it's chicken wings and pizza as favorites.

\*50 million: Cases of beer sold on Super Bowl Sunday.

18.8 million: Number of people who will miss work on the day after the Super Bowl.

\$1.3 billion: To be waged legally on Super Bowl LVIII, 20 percent increase over 2023;

## Personal Recollections

### MISS PENROD AND SHELBY WRIGHT

I totally enjoy most of the postings that I read on Facebook. I relate to lots of friends and family. There are several organizations that I stay connected with that support animals and others that relate to school bus drivers.

I enjoy the Southport High School Alumni account and some of the class connections. A week or so ago, the alumni page posted a large photo of Blanche Penrod. Miss Penrod was a graduate of Southport High School and Indiana Central College. She was dean of girls at Southport for 43 years, retiring in 1969. She was also a biology teacher and served as chairperson of the biology department.

Most of the students in my class, especially the girls, had heard many stories about Miss Penrod and her stern explanations that she passed out to female students. I sometimes would hear Miss Penrod stories and I doubt those stories ever caused a smile.

Our class started into high school as sophomores. The high school was still found in the old building on Orinoco. On my first day as a high school student and I walked into my last period of the day class, I was stunned. Our biology teacher was Miss Blanche Penrod.

She was very stern as she explained what our goals and expectations were for the year. We were assigned seats and books that day. We were also given a homework assignment that was due on the following day.

This continued for several days. Miss Penrod was all business. About the second Friday of that school year, we walked into the biology room and a motion picture projector and screen were set up. After the bell sounded and everyone took their seats, Miss Penrod explained to all of us that she learned and understood that students learned nothing during the last hour of school on Friday.

For that entire school year, our 6th period biology class watched enjoyable movies on Friday afternoons. We would be given homework assignments that were probably due on the following Monday.

Not many of my classmates experienced this 6th period movie party hosted by Miss Penrod and still to this day when I am talking with classmates and Miss Penrod's name comes up, I retell this story.

One of the young ladies that I met (Shelby Wright), drove to school and was a helper on my Beech Grove School Bus route. I met Shelby when she was in kindergarten, and we are still friends today.

Shelby is now an English teacher at Beech Grove Middle School. I read something she wrote last week about the joy and understanding of seeing some of her students start the process of moving from young children to the beginnings of adulthood. She explained how much she loves what she is doing. It is such a magical transformative period for many of them and how thankful she is to see and reflect a bit of their light. She then invited them to bring PlayStation controllers and play Fortnite with friends during the last part of a Friday afternoon in her classroom.

I quickly traveled from 2024 back to 1958 connecting Blanche Penrod and Shelby Wright. My wife, Lyn, has listened to Blanche Penrod stories for years. She was also amazed when I told her about Shelby's understanding of Friday afternoon learning.

# No. 2 Center Grove becomes only Southside team in girls' playoffs

Four Southside teams reached sectional championship games but only one team – No. 2-ranked Center Grove – emerged with a trophy.

The Trojans, as predicted, took care of business in the Mooresville Sectional defeating the host Pioneers, 61-41 after marching through Bloomington South, 47-20 and Greenwood, 47-24 to reach the championship game.

Juniors Ava Grant, 18 points, and Lilly Bischoff, 15 points, led the Trojans against Mooresville. Senior Aubrie Booker chipped in 11 points with classmates Audrey Annee adding nine points and Rachel Wirts eight points.

The Trojans are riding an 18-game winning streak.

Center Grove has 23 sectional championships and seeks its sixth regional title Saturday at 1 p.m. against Bedford North

Lawrence (20-4) on the Stars' home court. The high-ranking Trojans are chasing the program's first state title since 1996.

Franklin Central fell at Pike in a title thriller Saturday to the host Red Devils, 61-60. The Flashes were among five Southside teams in the seven-team 4A Pike Sectional field. FC spilled Ben Davis in the Friday night semifinal, 67-61 but Roncalli (13-9) fell to Pike, 62-39.

Resurgent Whiteland reached the title game of its 4A Sectional but fell to rival Franklin, coached by former Perry Meridian coach Mike Armstrong, 45-42 Saturday. The host Warriors downed East Central, 52-23 and Columbus East, 50-39. The Warriors finished with 12 wins for the second straight season.

At Eminence, Greenwood Christian Academy thumped Providence Cristo Rey, 87-6, and then met the host Eels in the championship game before falling, 52-26 Saturday. The Eels defeated Lutheran in an opening sectional thriller, 49-46.

Yes, Saturday's 61-60 loss to Pike in that team's sectional championship game was a heartbreaker.

But the Flashes' coach opted to look at the big picture.

"This program has 100 percent turned a corner," said that coach, Vince Cerbone. "I attribute that to our senior legacy. We have great senior leadership. They pushed all these girls."

Those seniors are Carys Wilson, Kaylee Rohrman, Sophia O'Brien and Lauren Baker.

"I'm proud of the kids," Cerbone said. "There's no negative to it." Just heartbreak.

The Flashes gave it their all. Freshman Payton DuVall played more like a senior. She used her 6-2 length to battle inside well enough to lead all scorers with 22 points on seven field goals and eight free throws. Another freshman, Aniya Doughty, scored 10 points on two 3-point field goals and two twos.

Wilson scored eight on two field goals and four free throws. Yet another freshman, Ashlee Baker, scored eight on one two and two 3's. Junior Lily Graves and freshman Riley Huotari added four each and junior Emma McVey hit one 3-pointer.

DuVall scored nine in the fourth quarter. Wilson's field goal accounted for the only other points in the final frame.

Diminutive freshman Saniya Smith and senior Morgan Crowe scored 16 each to

lead the Red Devils.

What hurt most was the fact that the Flashes appeared in control midway through the final quarter.

They established a 58-50 lead with 4:20 remaining. If they could increase the lead, that might be enough. If the Devils could decrease that lead, they could be back in it.

"I felt two or three different times we were just on the edge," Cerbone said. "We just couldn't get it there. We needed a killer instinct."

The Flashes were still up by four with just under two minutes remaining, and they blocked a shot by Smith. But instead of getting the stop, the ball bounced to Jazlyn Miller, who knocked down a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 60-59. When Franklin Central did not score on its ensuing possession, Pike ran the clock down a bit before Komari Booker hit a shot to put the Devils ahead.

The Flashes had time. They missed a shot, but in grabbing the defensive rebound, a Pike player appeared to step on the end line under the FC basket, but there was no call.

Instead, there was then a big scramble near the Devils' basket, with a Pike player called for traveling after diving on the loose ball.

With 6.3 showing, the Flashes hustled the ball up the right side. They passed to Graves, who put up a 3-pointer near the FC bench. The shot bounced off the rim as time ran out.

"It is a game of runs," Cerbone said. "They made plays in the last two minutes; we did not. But I'm still proud of the girls."

The club has 20 active students who meet after school and can fly during enrichment periods, evenings, or weekends.

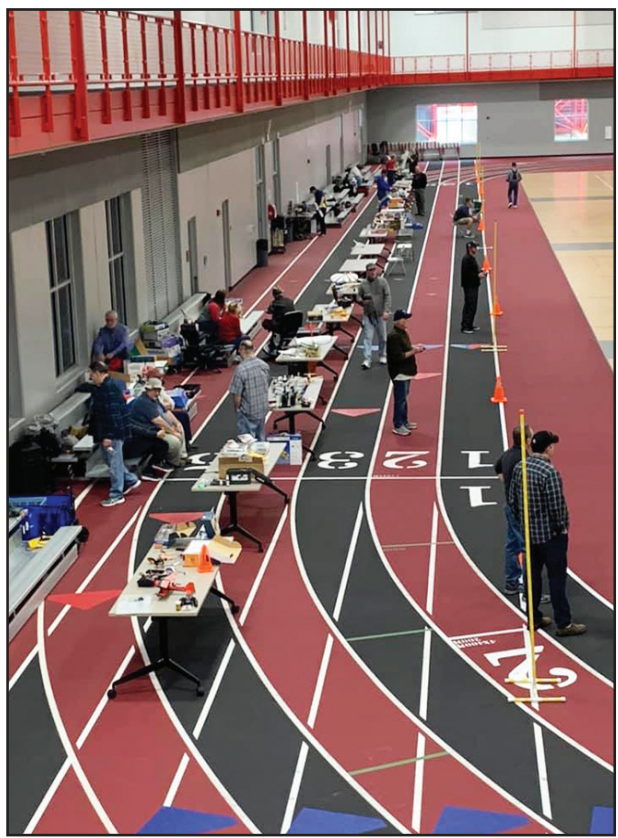
Schulz expressed his gratitude for the support and participation of Indy South RC Flying Club members for the high school flying club's activities.

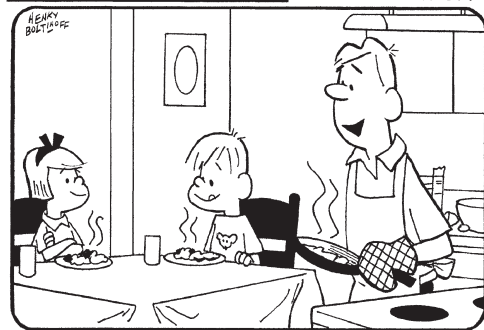

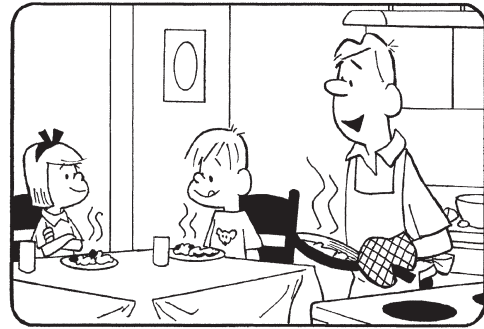


