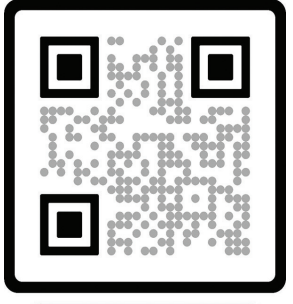

## Hawks start with young pitching staff

Over the years, Decatur Central softball has been a reflection of its pitching, as well as other capabilities. Here are a few of those:

Kylie Eads, class of 2022 (Southern Indiana), Emma Etter-Cox, 2021 (Indiana Wesleyan), Kenzee Smith, 2020 (University of Indianapolis).

There also have been hitters and fielders galore. Which makes 2023 an aberration of sorts.

"For the first time in a while, we will be coming into a softball season not having a pitcher with significant varsity experience," Ivey said.

"Our season will be paced by a freshman and two sophomores with very little experience."

In 2022, the Hawks were dominated in the circle by Eads, with 122 innings pitched.

"Kylie Vaseloff comes in with the most experience with 26 innings, followed by Hailey Cruz 3 innings and newcomer freshman Gracie Boggs," Ivey noted.

The coach said that Vaseloff gained her experience from necessity.

"We needed more pitchers last season, so we needed her," Ivey said.

The pitchers will be surrounded by talent.

"The Lady Hawks will lean on our offense to help ease the pressure of our pitching staff, with senior Laci Boggs (Mount Saint Joseph signee), senior Ella Phillips (Indiana Wesleyan signee) and Junior Jazlynn Stewart (.390 BA, 32 hits, 14 stolen bases," Ivey explained.

There's more.

The Hawks will depend on returnees like catcher Laci Boggs (.530 BA, 44 hits, 27 RBIs, 15 2Bs, 5 HRs); outfielder Ella Phillips (.316 BA, 24 hits, 21 RBIs, 5 HRs), and third baseman Jazlynn Stewart (.390 BA, 32 hits, 14 stolen bases).

"Boggs should get heavy consideration as an Indiana All-Star," Ivey said.

The coach listed promising newcomers.

Cruz: "Pitcher/shortstop. We're excited to see her pitching career unfold."

Vaseloff: "Shortstop/pitcher, good bat and very athletic, both in the field and at bat."

Junior Sydney Hazelwood: "Gold glove on our defense and will be our infield captain."

Junior Brielle Charles: "Shortstop/outfielder. Has shown us to expect great numbers this year with her bat."

Senior Riley Leverington: Outfielder. Fast, athletic outfielder who tracks the ball very well. Should be a key hitter in our lineup as well.

Senior Bekah Cruz: "Second base/pitcher. Gives us depth at many infield positions outside of being on our pitching staff."

Sophomore Hannah Harper: "First base/designated hitter. Saw some varsity action last year at first and will compete for innings this year at first base. Showed promise in her opportunities last year."

According to Ivey, other promising Hawks include Lyla McWhirter, Breanna Charles, Chloe Miller, Lilly Sears, Gracie Boggs, Madisyn Padgett, Maycee Hayman, Lena Czap and McKenna Rush.

"Our offense looks to be pretty good – it has been good in the offseason," Ivey continued. "We have seven seniors, but only three will start the season. We have a bunch of sophomores and juniors."

One senior had knee surgery and is out for the year: catcher/first baseman/designated hitter Aries Lovelace.

"Our defense has been OK, but we're young," Ivey continued. "Some were JV and some varsity. We have mixed them. Now, they're getting used to each other."

They will have to do so quickly.

Weather permitting, the Hawks opened their season at home against Ben Davis on Tuesday. They begin Mid-State Conference play April 4 at home against Perry Meridian before traveling to

the Falcons' field April 5.

"Coach Michaela Strykowski and I are entering Year 2 as a varsity staff and looking to improve this year with our young roster," Ivey said. "We are looking to return to a 20-plus win season and compete for a (Mid-State) conference title and a sectional title behind some strong hitting and defense."

"We were playing our best at the end of last season when we exited the sectionals and hope to continue that success at the start of this season with our young pitchers."

The boy's Indiana semi-state tournament was also in action. I was always changing television channels while trying to keep up with the teams that I have been following. Back in my younger days, I had teams that I loved and others that I didn't root for at any time. I have stepped back a few steps and now enjoy the games and root for teams that I might have a connection.

The Beech Grove boys' team had a good run this year. They made it to the Semi-State. They traveled to Seymour and played Guerin Catholic in the afternoon. Guerin won 58-46. The Hornets had a very good year.

The IU men's team played and won their game against Kent State. They won by 11 points. This game was totally played after my bedtime. Their second game was played late Sunday that resulted in an upset 85-69 win for Miami (Fla.) against the disappointed Hoosiers.

The IU women's team also won their first game of the tournament, defeating Tennessee Tech by 30 points in Assembly Hall. Their second game against Miami (Fla.) was played late Monday, too late for this week's deadline.

The Purdue woman's team also lost their first game of the tournament. I have enjoyed following this team for the last couple of years. Head Coach Katie Gearlds completed her second year coaching her Purdue team.

# Saints' comeback against Lions helps pave way to Gainbridge Fieldhouse

A comeback for the ages propelled underdog Lutheran over Loogootee and that same defensive intensity against Rock Creek Academy produced the Saints' first IHSAA Semistate championship Saturday since 2008 at Washington.

The Saints (19-7) advance to the IHSAA Class A state championship game against unranked Southwood (15-12) at 10:30 a.m. Saturday in Gainbridge Fieldhouse. Lutheran is seeking the program's first state title, having lost their only previous trip in 2008 to Triton.

"Defense and fearless" were the words that Lutheran coach Remus Woods used to describe the 2022-2023 Saints.

They lived up to those words in the final minutes Saturday morning against No. 4 Loogootee. Trailing by 10 points with very few minutes left, the No. 8 Saints ratcheted up their defensive intensity. They trimmed the lead in half within 40 seconds.

"It was desperation at that point," Woods later recalled.

The winning points came on a 3-pointer by sharpshooting senior Durray Smith and layup by sophomore Cayden Loescher, whose late-season improvement has sparked the

Saints' drive.

The final count was: Lutheran 67, Loogootee 66. A last-second three-quarter shot by L.J. Ward was waved off by officials.

Smith had a team-high 16 points on five of 12 3-pointers with Kam Patterson adding 14 points and six rebounds, and Loescher 11 points. Ward had five rebounds and four steals.

Between games, the Saints stayed at nearby Barr-Reeve High School where they rested, ate and had a short shoot-around before returning to Washington's famed Hatchet House.

The Saints never trailed in the nightcap in defeating a much taller Rock Creek team, 55-47.

The quick-handed Saints had 16 steals in the nightcap. Loescher led with 14 points and eight rebounds, Smith added 11 points and senior Aiden Alialy grabbed five rebounds.

"Our kids really got after it," Woods said.

The fourth-year coach continued, "We play tough opponents during the season and that prepares us for the playoffs."

The Saints take a 10-game winning streak Saturday morning into Gainbridge Fieldhouse. Info: ihsaa.org



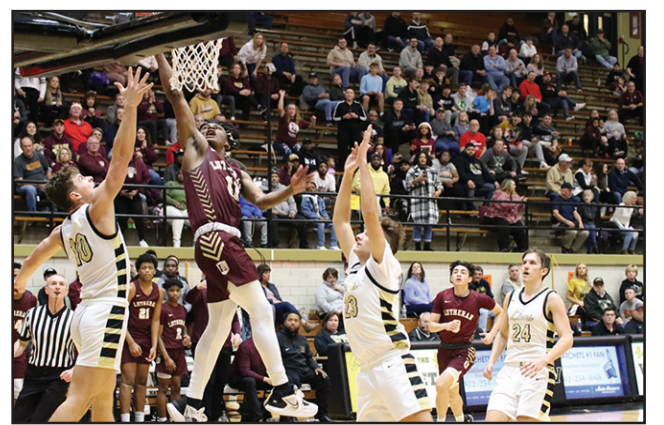

Cayden Loescher (10) scores as the Lutheran bench and crowd roars in closely fought win by the Saints, 67-66 against Loogootee Saturday.

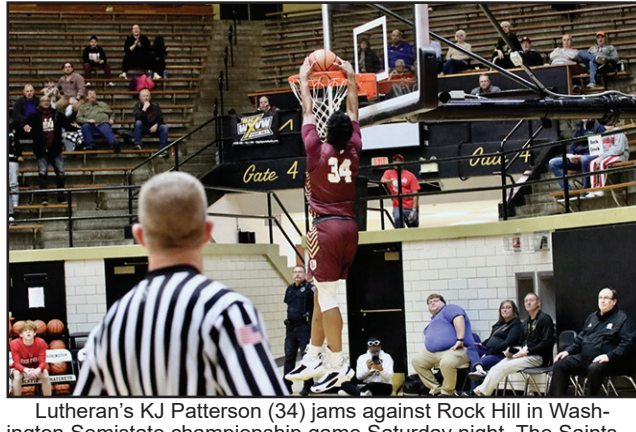

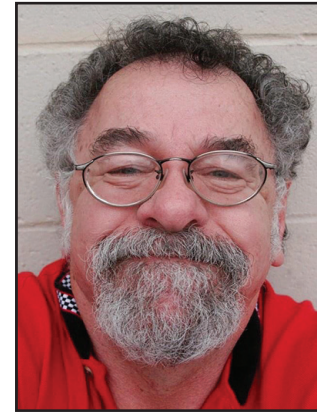

# Sweet 16 Contest attracts advertisers in unpredictable tourney without I.U., Purdue

Of all the millions of brackets entered in ESPN's perfect bracket contest, there are no perfect brackets left in the men's basketball tournament. However, on the Southside, 16 businesses that advertise in *The Southsider Voice* could be winners because they are entered in a Sweet 16 Contest.

Some businesses, depending upon how their drawn teams do in the tourney, will win free ads.

This has been an unpredictable tourney.

No. 16 Fairleigh Dickinson University, known as FDU, shocked No. 1 Purdue, becoming only the second 16-seed to beat a No. 1-seed in the tourney. FDU fell to C-USA champion Florida Atlantic University, coached by former Indiana University student manager Dusty May, 78-70 Sunday.

Seven high seeds are out of the running, No. 1 Kansas and Purdue, No. 2 Arizona and Marquette, No. 3 Baylor, and No. 4 Virginia and I.U.

I.U. took care of business in its late-night tourney opener Friday by downing Kent State, 71-60. Center Grove product Trayce Jackson-Davis added to his resume with 24 points, 11 rebounds, five blocks, and five assists. Senior forward Race Thomson added 20 points.

The resurgent Hoosiers made it to the second round for the first time since 2016 and the fifth time since 2008. Sunday I.U. ran into a quicker and sharper Miami (Fla.) Hurricane that opened with a ragged win against Drake. I.U. had difficulty in keeping up with the speedy and aggressive Canes, 85-69.

The tournament traditionally settles down in the Sweet 16 with fewer upsets as the No. 1 (Alabama and Houston) and No. 2 seeds (Texas and UCLA) advance. Eleven conferences are represented in the Sweet 16, including three from the Big East and SEC.

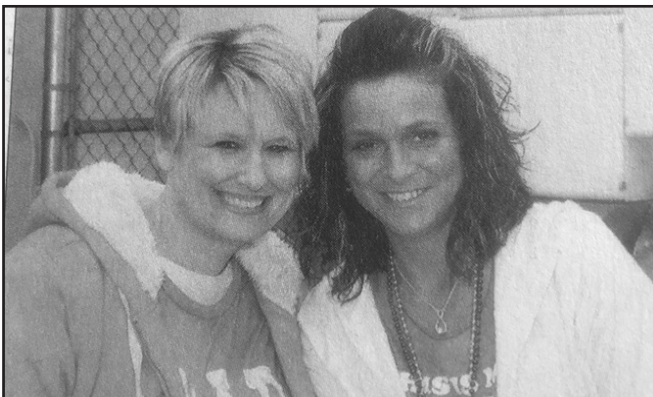

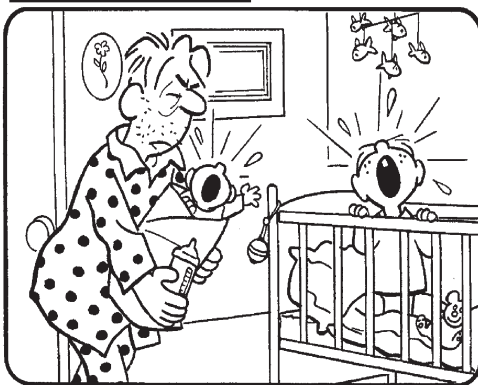

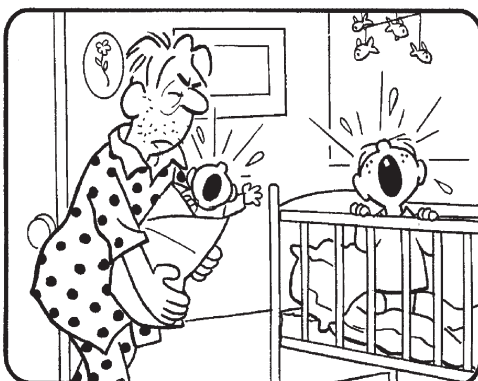

# Fouls costly as Hornets eliminated

SEYMOUR - Cam Brown said it all for he and his Beech Grove teammates following Saturday's semi-state basketball game.

"It just wasn't our day," said the 6-6 Brown, one of eight Hornet seniors.

"Guerin Catholic was playing well, defending well," he continued. "They were knocking down shots. Every time we hit a basket, they hit a basket."

Aided by Beech Grove's early foul troubles, the Golden Eagles pushed ahead in the second quarter and remained there, stopping the Hornets 58-46 in Saturday's second semifinal at Seymour High School.

Guerin, 20-8, then defeated Scottsburg 56-40 to win the semi-state title and advance to the Class 3A championship game.

The defending state champion Hornets finished 17-7 after the final game for Brown and his senior teammates - Adrian Holland, Skyleer Thacker, Jaleel Edwards, Jeremiah Tate, Jeremiah Alexander, Rylan Horen and Logan Muffler.

"I'm damn proud of this group," said first-year coach Joe Rihm. "That's a tough way to end the season, with everything this class has accomplished."

"This group had almost 60 wins. They ought to be damn proud of themselves. They were 14-2 with a state tournament, sweet 16, elite 8 and champions."

They were all of that in the last three seasons, two under Rihm and former coach Mike Renfro, going 55-20. Renfro and Rihm both succeeded the late Matt

English.

This team had shown the ability to smother its opponents, come back from deficits and put together winning rallies.

Just not on Saturday.

After scoring just five points in the second quarter, the Hornets opened the second half with a nice Alley Oop layup, but they went cold again.

In previous games, the Hornets have battled back no matter what.

But all those early fouls mounted up. So much so, that Guerin found itself shooting double-bonus free throws with 2:39 remaining in the third quarter.

That situation also forced the Hornets to soften their defense. They scored just nine points in the third period and found themselves trailing 44-29 after Lucas Parker knocked down a three-point buzzer beater as time expired in the quarter.

The Golden Eagles, despite managing just two field goals in the final frame, responded by converting 10 of 15 free throws in that span.

Brown led the Hornets by scoring 13 points, eight in the final eight minutes. Alexander scored 10, Edwards 9, Tate 6, Holland 5 for his team's only points in the second period, and Horen 3.

To their credit, the Hornets converted all eight of their free throws, while Guerin was 16 of 26. Sophomore Bryson Cardinal led the Golden Eagles with 15.

"The fouls early got us out of our game," Rihm said. "With those fouls, we weren't able to get up, get into it. We just couldn't get

shots to fall. That was a big difference in the ballgame."

After meeting with his players for an extended post-game session, Rihm sent them back out, where they were greeted and consoled by families and

friends.

"Coach English had the vision," Rihm said. "He saw this group coming."

"This senior group has set the foundation - no, the expectations - for what Beech Grove basketball is. Now, they can continue that."

# Dreyer Reinbold drivers big part of buzz about Indy 500 in May

Multiple-motor-sports team owner Dennis Reinbold was in California recently for the championship rounds of the NRX Rallycross Series for FCI-S all-electric vehicles.

No worries if that alphabet soup is confusing because the topic out West also turned to the two Dreyer Reinbold Racing (DRR) entries in the 107th Indianapolis 500 with drivers Stefan Wilson and 2014 Indianapolis 500 winner Ryan Hunter-Reay.

Hunter-Reay was announced last week, but Wilson was with Reinbold, who owns an auto dealership in Greenwood, at the Rallycross event in California and took time for an exclusive interview with The Southsider Voice.

Obviously, the "500" was a big part of the buzz during the NRX Rallycross Series. Wilson and Reinbold are ecstatic that Hunter-Reay is on board. Wilson and the 500 winner were teammates in 2015 and 2021 with a different team.

"It's good to have that relationship with Ryan," said Wilson, brother of the late Justin Wilson who was fatally injured in an IndyCar race at Pocono in 2015. "Our setups are similar. His past experience will be a big team asset."

Reinbold landed Hunter-Reay after the Floridian driver had visited the Dreyer-Reinbold race shop several times on Indy's northside.

"He (Ryan) has a comfort level after seeing our shop and realizing that being in a 500-only mode makes us well-prepared. Ryan was impressed," Reinbold said. "He's a proven winner at the Speedway and a tremendously talented driver."

Hunter-Reay joins former 500 winners Al Unser Jr., Buddy Lazier, and Buddy Rice among the 45 previous DRR drivers since 2000. And he returns to Chevrolet power which he utilized in winning the 2012 Indy Car Series.

After a 12-year run with Andretti Autosport and longtime DHL backing, Formula One veteran Roman Grosjean inherited that seat. Without a ride in 2021, Hunter-Reay coached Hollinger Racing rook Callum Iott for last year's 500. In three of his last four starts for Andretti, Hunter-Reay finished fifth, eighth and 10th.

However, Hunter-Reay, 42, vowed that he would return to the 500 in a competitive ride.

After a year's absence from the "500," Hunter-Reay admits that he is once again "laser-focused and energized" with DRR and that "the Indy 500 isn't just a motor race, for me; it's a way of life."

"DRR is a streamlined program that puts all its energy into the month of May," Hunter-Reay stated in a news release last week. "I guess you can say I'm going back to my roots, considering how I started my IndyCar career with smaller teams that took the fight to the bigger efforts and won. If you look at DRR's record at Indy and their impressive recent results, the pool of talented engineers and crew; it's a perfect fit."

Hunter-Reay has 18 career IndyCar wins and an Indy 500 career that includes five starts among the top seven and six top-10 finishes as well as his 2014 win.

The entry for Hunter-Reay is the 33rd entry for the upcoming May 28 classic.

DRR consistently has fielded entries that have finished among the top 10, including fourth place in 2012 with Oriol Servia, seventh with Sage Karam in 2021, and 10th with Santino Ferrucci last year.

Hunter-Reay is assigned the No. 23 DRR entry with Wilson in the No. 24 joint DRR entry with Cusick Motorsports. Wilson's best "500" finish is 15th in 2018 after leading with only four laps to go.

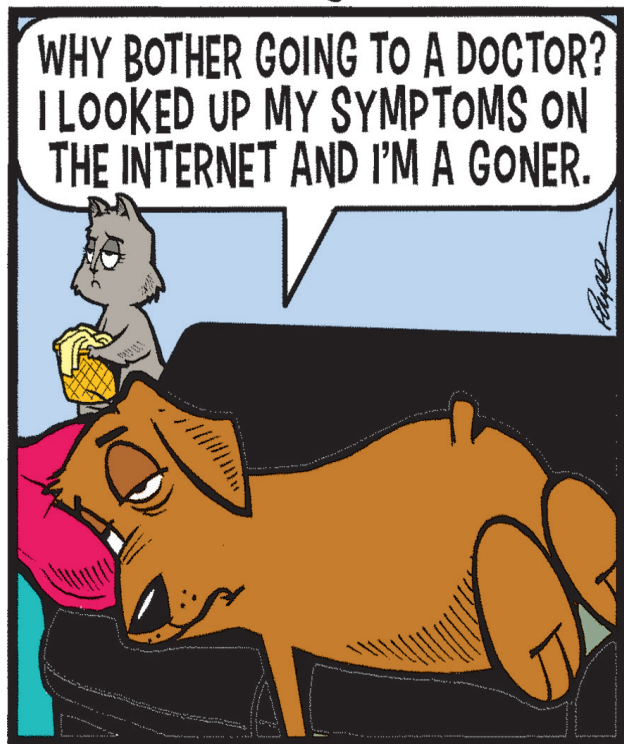

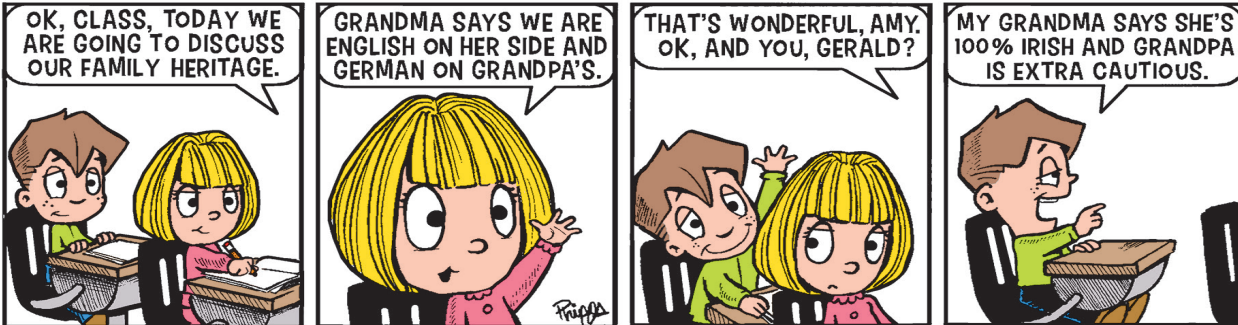

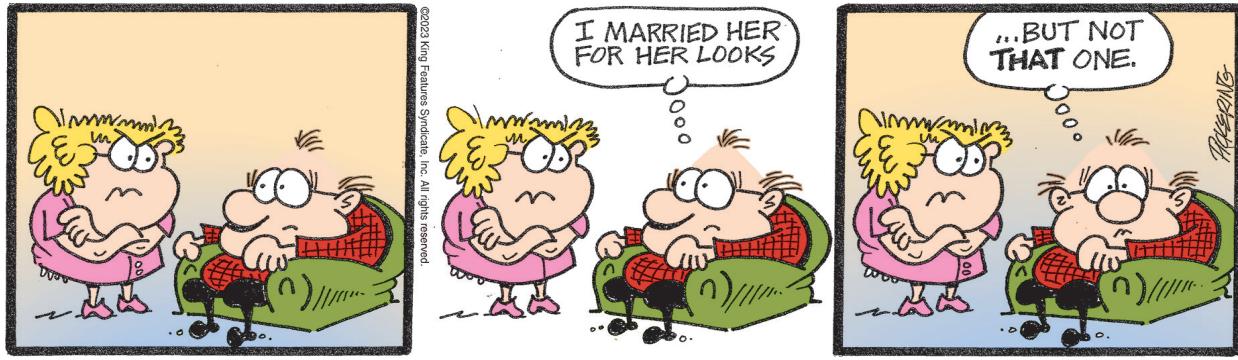
