# **ROYAL LEGACY**

One-run loss to Penn in thriller ends three-year softball careers of eight seniors after 95 wins and two IHSAA state championships

### **COACH CONGRATULATES** ROTHROCK ON HOME RUN

95 wins, six losses, and

That's just part of the legacy that eight seniors on the Roncalli softball team leave behind after three seasons for Royals to strive for.

Oh, the Royals also had a state record-tying 47- game winning streak as part of a 50-game unbeaten streak. And they made three Class 4A IHSÁA state championship game appearances, winning titles in 2021 and 2022, capturing three consecutive sectional, regional, and semistate trophies, two Marion County championships, and three

Circle City Conference titles. There's more, too. The Rovals were the No. 1 hig school softball team in the nation in 2022, the same season that Keagan Rothrock was anointed as the Gatorade National Player of the Year as well as a three-time Indiana player of the year.

All those achievements will be realized within a few days or weeks as the seniors depart for their upcoming college experiences. For the time being, the Royals 2-1 loss to Penn in nine innings Saturday at Bittinger Stadium on the Purdue University campus stings The Royals were attempting to become the first 4A team to win three consecutive state titles. Penn is now a two-time state champion.

"I think when everyone gets over this, it will show how amazing this team was and what we (seniors) accomplished," said senior outfielder Abbey Hofmann, who was awarded the 4A IHSAA Softball Mental Attitude Award after the game and \$1,000 scholarship donated to Roncalli in her honor. "For our fans applauding us, that means everything. We had so much fun together and that's why we were able to accomplish so much. There was so much buzz about this team through our three years. Eventually we will think about all the positives instead of this negative. We know next year's team will step up.'

Coach David Lauck also looked at everything the Royals accomplished on the field the last three years (2020 was cancelled due to COVID).

"It has been incredible, 95 wins over three years," said Lauck whose 15-year record at Roncalli is 363-74-1. "They have completely energized our entire school as far as school spirit; it has been awesome to be a small part of that as their coach. More than anything, we need to celebrate a fantastic career for those girls (seniors). These seniors have à lot of good things ahead of

The seniors included 2022 Gatorade National Player of

the Year Rothrock, Meek, Hofmann, Lyla Blackwell, Kaitlyn Leister, Lauren Marsicek, Abby

Willis, and Anna Dressman. The Royals entered their third straight state championship game after defeating Lake Central, 4-1 at Center Grove in 2021 and a record-shattering win against West Lafayette Harrison, 16-0 last year on this

same field at Purdue. After battling back from two calf surgeries all season, Rothrock allowed only three hits and struck out 17 Kingsmen. Only one of Penn's two runs

was an earned run. The Team USA gold medal-ist provided Roncalli fans with high hopes in the bottom of the seventh with a towering lead-off home run on a 3-2 change-up pitch well over the leftfield wall.

"I was crying around the bases," Rothrock said. "That was my moment to keep my team in the game and give us a chance to win. I was almost crying before my at-bat because it was now or never and that could be my last at-bat.

Marsicek singled to rightfield and Blackwell was hit by a pitch to load the bases with two outs, but the rally failed when the next Royal struck out.

Lauck also savored the home run and said, "That was crazy. What a moment for her to tie the game up in the bottom of the seventh inning. Your best player is up in the biggest moment and ties it and then we load the bases. I thought, yeah, we were going to wind up winning this game. That was a good memory that she'll never forget and the fans that are here will never forget.

The Royals made solid plays early. Third baseman Carley Keller made a highreaching grab of a pop foul against the Royals dugout fence in the second inning. In the fifth inning, the Royals trapped Penn's Abby Widmar in a rundown between third and home. However with two outs in the same inning, Penn went

up 1-0 when a throw to first base was dropped. There were more odd plavs

that plagued the Royals. Blackwell, who stole a record four bases in the 2022 state title game, was thrown out attempting to steal second in a close play in the first inning. The Royals threatened in their home fifth with runners on second and third and two outs, but a ground out ended the threat. An odd play with Roncalli threatening to score more than one run in the seventh resulted in a second out when Willis was hit by her own bunt. And the oddest of all plays, a wild pitch in the top of the ninth brought in the winning run from third base, although Rothrock responded by striking out three Kingsmen. And the game ended when a Royals runner from first to second interfered with the second baseman fielding a grounder.

Penn's pitching duo of junior starter Aubrey Zachary (3.1 innings) and sophomore reliever Olivia Signorino (5.2 innings) combined for four hits, one earned run, eight strikeouts and two walks. A true pitcher's duel, Rothrock threw 98 strikes with 129 pitches. The Penn hurlers combined for 87 strikes with 131 pitches.

After the game, Rothrock expressed her appreciation by saying, "I'm so thankful to be a Royal and have this kind of community support all the time. I love these seniors; they are my best friends in the whole world. This is so emotional and we were able to play in this (third) championship game.

The Royals expect to return next season with state championship game starters, junior Emma Fegan and sopho-more Carley Keller, plus three juniors, two sophomores, and three freshmen from this year's



After months of restoring its community, the Fountain Square Neighborhood Association hosted a home show.







# Hornets change softball program history in one sensational season

Beech Grove High School's softball team is coming off a history-making season and anxious to begin the 2024 campaign.

This year's team set alltime program benchmarks by winning 21 games, firsttime sectional and regional championships and initial appearance in the IHSAA semistate tourney. The Hornets bowed out to 3A No. 1 Tri-West, 8-1 to reach the playoffs Class 3A Elite Eight and establish several individual single-season records.

And the Hornets set numerous single-season individual performance records along the way with the potential to break some of their own records in 2024.

The Hornets experienced support for the softball program that had never been experienced before. When the Hornets returned to the high school after shutting out Hamilton Heights, 10-0 for the regional trophy, fans, students, Mayor Dennis Buckley, community, and kids turned out to greet them. And they received a rousing community sendoff to the Jasper Semistate where they fell to the No. 1 ranked Bruins.

"They welcomed our kids back (regional) and it made my heart sing, I was so happy for our girls," Ferrell recalled. "The community really did rally around us and they did the same for our semistate sendoff. People had to take time off from work for that. Those are memories that the girls will remember the rest of their lives ... and it's just the beginning!"

"Those three became the brains of the operation," Ferrell said in the aftermath of a multitude of hospital visits with Baylor. "They took over the reins, everything. I came to games and was their biggest fan."

Carmichael, who had never coached high school softball, brought vast travel ball coaching experience along with Moore.

"With Kacy in the background running things, we relied on our travel ball experiences and coached them like they were elite," Carmichael said. "I think that helped in their success because they are elite with what they accomplished this season.

The Hornets opened with 10 consecutive wins, including a 6-0 triumph against Cathedral but then went 8-6 with losses to Franklin Central in the county tourney and to Lutheran and Indian Creek to end the season 18-6. They were 3-6 during the regular season in games

decided by four runs or less. "We had so many close

games and that made us tougher," Ferrell said. "The girls fought all season, so I got to see them fight through and come out on top. We began to rise above our adversity and become better prepared for the postseason. The way they competed against bigger schools is a true test of their maturity.'

Beech Grove defeated Herron, 23-0 and Speedway, 12-2 for their first sectional trophy and Hamilton Heights, 10-0 for their first regional title. The Hornets were plagued by miscues at Jasper and fell to No. 1 Tri-West and junior pitcher Audrey Lowry, an Oklahoma recruit, in the semistate opener. Lowry struck out 14 Hornets.

"We were prepared for the game but not for the moment," assistant coach Carmichael recalled. "Tri-West had been there before and none of us had been to a semistate. We know what the atmosphere is like now but we didn't play our best game and it cost us.'

Team leaders throughout the season included battery mates Moore (18-5; .575 batting average, 50 hits, 46 RBI) and catcher Jansen

(.532, 50 hits), Robinson (.460, 46 runs scored), and Boling (.407, 33 hits).

Most of the Hornets' single-season records, including their .393 batting average, were set by this year's team, indicative of their improvement.

Moore, who is with Indiana Magic Gold this summer, added mental maturity to her game, according to Carmichael. She did not get down on herself when opponents got hits off her pitches. And she developed more spin on the ball with a variety of pitches, including a screwball, curve, and rise

Jansen, playing travel ball for Indy Crush, became more of a contact hitter by making better pitch selec-

Robinson, with the Indiana Gators this summer, improved her mental approach at the plate and developed into a triple threat at the plate. She has speed on the basepaths, too.

Boling raised her overall batting average to more than .400 with a surge after midseason. She worked on staying down in the zone at the plate and using her strength




