PLACEMENT OF PLAQUE **CITES WHITELAND TRACK** FOR ITS HISTORY, IMPACT

A special ceremony Sunday afternoon at revived Whiteland Raceway Park honored the karting track among the oldest in America. Current owners, Beech Grove native Andy O'Gara and wife Sarah Fisher O'Gara, unveiled the double-sided historical plaque that honors the facility's history and impact motorsports. The plaque is the 48th to be placed in the state by the Indiana Memorial Racing Association (IRMA). Dignitaries at the unveiling included Indiana Rep. Michelle Davs of Whiteland and Sen. Randall Frye, chair of the Statehouse's motorsports caucus. The karting track opened in 1960 and has been the learning grounds for many nationally famous race car drivers. The O'Gara's saved the facility from extinction in 2019 by buying it. Since then, they have improved and expanded the track with garages, office building, karting products and modern scoring tower with plans for the adjacent 25 acres north of WRP for RVs and camping. The track is open most weekday afternoons and evenings for tests and practice. WRP is at 654 N. Front St., Whiteland.

Racer Kyle O'Gara rides hot streak with three straight pavement wins



Beech Grove native Kyle O'Gara celebrates 100-lap sprint car race win Saturday night at Anderson Speedway with wife Marissa and crew members, mechanic Nick Lundgreen and crew chief Brad Larsen.

Kyle O'Gara is on the hottest streak of his open-wheel pavement racing career with three consecutive wins.

First, the 27-year-old Beech Grove native captured his first-ever win June 30 at Lucas Oil Indianapolis Raceway Park (IRP) in a 35-lap special event USAC midget car feature.

And then last Saturday at the high-banked quarter-mile Anderson Speedway, O'Gara took the 50-lap midget car feature and the prestigious 22nd annual Glenn Neibel Memorial 100-lap 500 Sprint Car Series race. Neibel's drivers won the Little 500 six times and two USAC championships.

"First one in a long time," O'Gara smiled Sunday at Whiteland Raceway Park before the unveiling of an historical

"Our last double-header win was in karting about 14 years ago," he added. "But that doesn't compare in any way to last night (Saturday) at Anderson because that memorial sprint car race is so prestigious to win.

Neibel, whose engine shop was in Edinburgh, powered drivers to six Little 500 wins and

two USAC championships. At Anderson, O'Gara started the memorial race in fourth place, moved to second in one lap and took the lead nine laps

He won the opening midget car feature after starting third, grabbed second immediately and passed Bobby Santos on

lap 10.
"I think running the midget car race helps because we need more laps up there," O'Gara said. "The midget translates to the sprint car, driving-style wise. The hundred lap sprint car race went quick and was easy.'

The sprint car is sponsored by O'Gara's Irish Pub in Beech Grove and the midget car is backed by SFHR Development, Chick-fil-A, and Speedway Indoor Karting.

He still considers the fiveeighths-mile paved IRP in Brownsburg as his home track

"Our entire family enjoys going there (IRP) and it's close to our shop (Speedway Indoor Karting)," O'Gara said. "We battle against some of the best pavement racers in the country,

and we finally beat them "

He took his first USAC feature win at IRP by passing Bobby Santos on lap 20 and holding off Chuck Gurney in a five-lap sprint to the finish after a late-race caution. O'Gara finished third earlier that night at IRP in a USAC sprint car

Kyle's dad, John O'Gara, is a former crew chief for several

Indianapolis 500 drivers including Sarah Fisher who married Kyle's older brother, Andy O'Gara, a crew chief and race strategist, in 2007 at St. Roch Catholic Church. Their roots are in karting and their two kids, Zoey and Danny, race karts at Whiteland Raceway Park. Kyle also began racing karts at WRP. He won a USAC/STARS

midget car race in August 2012 at Grundy County Speedway before he started his senior year at Roncalli. Before graduating, he raced in the Indy Lights Freedom 100 at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. In May, Kyle was fourth in his fifth Little 500 sprint car classic at

Anderson Speedway where he matched his best finish of 2020. Through the years, Kyle has won several races but none as prestigious as Saturday's sprint car race at Anderson.

Off the track, Kyle is vice president of operations at Speedway Indoor Karting in Speedway and Daytona Beach and a managing partner at WRP

A Roncalli High School alumnus, Kyle and his wife Marissa enjoy their home life and their two dogs.

"I'm happy where we're at; we're traveling the country as a family and doing what we love," Kyle said. "As long as I can stay in a seat in a race car, I'm happy.

"They are excited about getting their own veggies to eat after taking care of the plants", Miller stated with a smile.



The club kids have really enjoyed this outside adventure and has helped educate them on how to take care of plants and grow their own food. Last week they picked their first strawberry.





CONNECTING WITH FRIENDS

Over the last couple of weeks, I have enjoyed attending a couple of birthday parties and visiting with a good friend that I have known, worked with and served in the Indiana National Guard with. Jack Hickson has had some serious medical issues and is doing rehab in a nursing facility at the present time.

At Larrie (Bud) Johnson's birthday party, I reconnected with his two sisters and his brother Mick's wife, Patty. Mickey (Michael Howard) Johnson passed away, way too early. We all have missed him over the years.

Patty reminded me of one on my favorite Mickey Johnson stories. In the late 60's, my dad and I operated a couple of Sunoco service stations. He was usually at the Madison Avenue business and I worked at the station located at the intersection of Carson and Hanna avenues, both were both "full service" stations and opened at 6:00 a.m. and closed at 10:00 p.m. One morning as I arrived at work, I noticed a car parked directly in front of the main customer entry door. I immediately recognized the auto as being owned by Mickey Johnson. I walked by the car and noticed that it was empty and the keys were laying on the driver's seat.

I continued to open the station for business. I figured his car needed some repairs and was dropped off during the night. I figured that if I hadn't heard from him by 10:00 a.m., I would call him for

Around 8:00 a.m., I began hearing some noises coming from the trunk of the car. Soon those mumbling sounds became shouts of "Get me out of here!" which were interlaced with profanities. I grabbed the keys and unlocked the trunk. As the lid opened, I discovered the car's disheveled and confused owner.

I later found out that Mick and some friends were at a lively party. When it was time to leave, everyone concurred that Mick was in no shape to drive. It was decided that a friend would drive him home and another friend would follow to collect the helpful driver. Well, either Mick couldn't give proper directions to his home or he didn't want to go home in his present condition. So, they drove him to our service station and locked him in his trunk.

We had lots of fun during those years, but we also had several people who watched over us and made sure we learned and matured as we should.

A good friend of my father's was employed and served in the Indiana National Guard. This was during the Viet Nam war years. Most young guys had to either be drafted or join a branch of the service. I didn't realize for many years how much my dad's friend had to do with our National Guard service.

Jack Hickson and I were assigned to the very same Indiana National Guard Company. We completed basic training in the very same training company at Ft. Knox. We were both members of the motor pool in our unit based at Stout Field here in Indianapolis.

Larrie Johnson joined about the same time. His National Guard unit was also located in Indianapolis and was very suited to his skills. A couple of years later, his brother, Mickey joined the guard and after basic training was assigned to the same unit that Jack and I served.

As I look back on those times, I find it astounding that Jack Hickson, Mickey Johnson and Fred Shonk were serving in the very same national guard unit and motor pool. There were thousands of people serving in the Indiana National Guard at that time. Three of us that grew up within a couple of blocks of Madison Avenue ended up serving in the same nine-person motor pool.
